About the Estate:

Created in 1862, after the dismembering of Figeac, De VALOIS vineyard took its present name in 1886 and does really spans across the 2 most famous appellations: Saint-Emiliion & Pomerol. Frédéric LEYDET, now runs this family estate bought by his ancestors and passed down by women of each generation. This is why the name of the owners has unceasingly changed since the 19th century. Frederic's father Bernard LEYDET began running the estate in 1962 with only few hectares then, and bought some more superbly located around, up until the time of his death in 2006.

Frederic LEYDET has only one goal in mind: keep the full expression of is truly unique terroir, L'ECLAT de VALOIS is an extremely limited production made from more than 60 year old vines (planted in 1958 by Frederic Grand-father Jacques Leydet) with high 6.250 plants / hectare density, taken care with a unique attention; Very short pruning, de-budding, double green harvesting & leaves' removal to optimize maturity. Hand harvesting with an additional berries sorting before destemming. Alcoholic & malolactic fermentations take place in new oak barrels. Bottled without filtration.

The 2018 is 82% Cabernet Franc & 18% Merlot! Sublime Eclat de Valois, belonging - with Chateau L'Evangile - to La Revue du Vin de France 3 "Coup de Coeur" for 2018 Vintage in Pomerol. Brilliant!
